
We acknowledge that the sovereignty of this Nation was never ceded and pay our respects to Elders past and present.

Experiment 2: Befriending Self, Others & Community





Workshops that nurture self-awareness and contributions through relationships.

Co-hosted in Armadale with member-based associations.

Experiment 3: Give-it-a-Go Hobby-Share



A localised term-length series of connection & discovery through hands-on participation.

- Micro-contribution. Hands-on communityconnecting through hobby-sharing.
- Localised. Pavilion next to the Primary School.
- **Regular.** Thursday afternoon routine prior to school pick-up.
- Flexible. Drop-in participation style.
- Starting point. Supported pathways to progress to running hobby groups.




Summary of Perspectives
