WA universities join forces to celebrate National Student Volunteer Week 2021



70 student volunteers will come together this Saturday to kick off **National Student Volunteer Week (9-15 August)**, with Western Australia's only annual Inter-Uni Beach Conservation Challenge. Students from UWA Guild Volunteering, Curtin Volunteers!, The University of Notre Dame Australia, and Murdoch Volunteering Hub will converge at Leighton Beach to:

- Clean up micro plastics.
- Plant coastal plants and restore the dunes.
- Learn about our delicate coastal life from experts Perth NRM.

Under the expert guidance of Perth NRM, the inter-university team of 70 student volunteers will remove common pervasive weeds from the dunes, clear up litter and marine debris and plant local species, creating a once again pristine environment in this beautiful coastal area.

National Student Volunteer Week (NSVW) runs from 9 – 15 August, providing an opportunity to acknowledge the impact that student volunteers make through volunteering.

Education providers, volunteer organisations and students all over Australia will be celebrating #NSVW21 through a variety of events, activities and campaigns that celebrate student volunteers and connect young people with opportunities to get involved in volunteering.

Other activities throughout the week, include:

August 9 - virtual card making for Relay for Life.

August 10 – NSVW Volunteering Festival at UWA Guild Centre, with a range of stalls and microvolunteering activities including: pack safe sex packs for WA AIDS Council; make doggy treats for Dogs Refuge Home WA; craft for Relay For Life UWA; origami with Amnesty International UWA. **August 13 –** AUSMAP Micro Plastic Survey & Debris Clean at Matilda Bay.

Volunteering WA CEO Tina Williams said she was pleased to see how much emphasis and importance Western Australian tertiary institutions place on volunteering on celebrating NSVW.

"Volunteering provides a unique opportunity for students to make a difference in causes they are passionate about, as well as developing their skills which can often lead to a pathway to employment.
