Vaccination of residential aged care facility (RACF) workers, in reach workforce, students and volunteers engaged by the RACF will <u>become mandatory</u> in the next month.

Workers must receive at least the first dose of a COVID-19 vaccine (all are eligible for Pfizer) by 17 September 2021 to enter a residential aged care facility from this date onwards.

We know this will raise many questions among those involved in aged care, including volunteers and others, who are included in these directions.

It is very important that everybody involved in residential aged care understands that COVID-19 poses a significant risk for elderly people, who are most at risk of contracting the virus and more likely to suffer severe health consequences from the virus.

Vaccination against COVID-19 will help protect workers and residents at aged care facilities from contracting and spreading the infection, and from severe disease and death.

WA Health has developed <u>Frequently asked Questions</u> which cover important concerns including pay, medical exemptions and more.
