



An innovative approach to link VIOs with Youth and assist with creating meaningful, youth-centered volunteering opportunities.








WHY a Youth Project? - the background





What did we learn?


Students: want to make a difference to the lives of others, gain new skills, knowledge and experience, are lacking time & need flexibility, are anxious to not fit in and new situations, not knowing what might be required, where to find the right organisation with meaningful opportunities and how to get started altogether.

VIOs: underestimate the skills and passions of youth, don't consider young volunteers because of insurance, they might be too 'hard to handle', perceived as a bit unreliable or not capable, cultural gap.

There is a need to break down barriers to create mutual understanding and a fresh approach to youth-adequate volunteering positions.






